The Art of Hearing Heartbeats - Discussion Questions

- 1. What does the back and forth between Julia's and U Ba's narratives add to the love story of Tin Win and Mi Mi? How do these storylines interrelate?
- 2. Tin Win is abandoned as a child, while Mi Mi grows up in a close knit family. Do you see these differences reflected in the adults they become or in how they relate to each other?
- 3. After losing his sight, Tin Win studies at a monastery under U May. What does U May model for Tin Win, and how does Tin Win grow in these years?
- 4. Tin Win's uncle U Saw funds Tin Win's eye operation and education abroad but blocks all communication with Mi Mi. Is U Saw a villain, or is he something more complicated? Why?
- 5. Parts of the novel are written as letters. Does this form change the mood or flow of the story? How does it affect your view of the characters?
- 6. Tin Win and Mi Mi form a symbiotic bond: he walks for her and she becomes his eyes. They are then separated for decades. Given what you know about them, how are they able to endure the time apart?
- 7. Discuss the role of memory in the novel, both individual and collective. How does memory shape choices for Julia, Tin Win, and Mi Mi?
- 8. Burma, now Myanmar, was under British rule from the nineteenth century until 1948. How important is this colonial history to the novel's major events?
- 9. Prophecy and superstition are central to Burmese culture. Do these beliefs inspire a feeling of security or anxiety in the main characters, and why?
- 10. The book contrasts Western and Eastern values individualism and personal achievement versus kinship and transcendence. Where and how are these differences brought to light?
