

Book Club Questions The Unmaking of June Farrow by Adrienne Young

- 1. What were your impressions of June as a protagonist? Did you find her to be an unreliable narrator at times?
- 2. Do you think June was right to leave her family to protect Annie from the Farrow curse, or was it more harmful? Why?
- 3. Did you admire Margaret's loyalty to June, or do you think she should have questioned her more?
- 4. Regarding Eamon, can personal happiness and family responsibility be balanced, or does someone always have to sacrifice too much?
- 5. Caleb, the sheriff, is fixated on discovering who killed his father, even if it harms June. Some view his dedication to the truth as admirable, while others believe he's trapped by his family's past. Did Caleb make the right choice in pursuing June, or should he have moved on from the past?
- 6. The Farrow women make difficult choices to challenge expectations of mothers and daughters. Do you think it's better to stick to family traditions or break away from them, even if it upsets others? Which characters do you relate to more?
- 7. How did your view of Stella's choices change as more of the family's past came to light? Do you think her actions were motivated by love, selfishness, or something else?
- 8. Is June's romance in the book driven by destiny, or is it based on real choice and chemistry? How does their relationship relate to the idea of fate?
- 9. Family relationships, especially with her grandmother, are important in June's life. How do the secrets and sacrifices of past generations impact the family dynamics today? Were the grandmother's choices justified considering the family's history?
- 10. How did the author's portrayal of time travel as more magical and chaotic than scientific affect your experience of the story? Did this make it more interesting or confusing, and how did it impact the stakes of June's journey?
- 11. June's past choices shape her present. In a story where the past can change, what do you think about destiny versus choice? Were June's actions truly her own, or were they influenced by her family's legacy?
- 12. Did the ending surprise you, particularly with June's choice to remain in the past timeline? What about the lack of closure in Mason's character arc? What do you believe the final scene suggests about the future for her and her family?
